### Departure Day Details

1. Meet at the Northwest or Continental Ticket Counter at Louisville Airport.
2. Have your Photo-ID and flight wallet on your person.
3. Please read the "Air Travel" section of this booklet and be prepared.
4. The following baggage limitations apply to Northwest and Continental Airlines:

1 Carry-on bag, not to exceed 40 pounds weight nor 51 linear inches in size (1 length + 1 width + 1 height, e.g., 22" X 16" X 13" = 51"). A small instrument that fits within these limits may serve as your carry-on bag.

1 Carry-on personal item, such as a purse, small camera bag, laptop computer, etc.

1 Checked bag, not to exceed 50 pounds weight nor 62 linear inches (e.g., 28" X 10" X 24" = 62") in size, plus, if applicable, 1 instrument, within these limits.

### FLIGHT A SCHEDULE

#### 5:00am Flight A Check-in for NW 875

Check-in at the Northwest Airlines Ticket Counter for NW Flt. 875 to Minneapolis. Present your Photo I.D., if 18 or older, and receive your boarding pass. Don't lose the flight folder Northwest gives you, which contains your luggage claim checks and boarding pass(es). Next, immediately go with a chaperone to the departure gate. Once at the gate, you may have time for restrooms and food.

#### 7:00am Flight A Depart Louisville

Northwest Airlines Flt. 875, non-stop DC9-50 jet service, departs for Minneapolis. Flight time is 2 hours, 1 minute. Complimentary beverages (but NO food) will be served. Food is available for purchase at your expense. Set your watch back 1 hour to 6:00am, Minneapolis time.

**8:01am Flight A Arrive Minneapolis**

Arrive Minneapolis, Lindbergh Terminal. Don't leave any of your possessions on the aircraft. Wait at the Arrival Gate until all have deplaned. Then, walk as a group to the departure gate in the Lindbergh Terminal for your next flight. Once at the new departure gate, you may have time for restrooms and food.

**11:40am Flight A Depart Minneapolis**

Northwest Airlines Flt. 809, non-stop Airbus A330-300 jet service, departs for Honolulu. Flight time is 8 hours, 30 minutes. Complimentary beverages (but NO food) will be served. Food is available for purchase at your expense. Set your watch back 5 hours to 6:40am, local time in Hawaii.

**3:10pm Flight A Arrive Honolulu**

Wait at the Arrival Gate until all have deplaned. Don't leave any of your things on the aircraft. Walk as a group to exit the secured area. You'll be met and welcomed to the islands once you leave the secured area.

Check-in at the Continental Airlines/Chautauqua Airlines Ticket Counter for CO Flt. 3259 to Houston. Present your Photo I.D., if 18 or older, and receive your boarding pass. Don't lose the flight folder Continental gives you, which contains your luggage claim checks and boarding pass(es). Next, immediately go with a chaperone to the departure gate. Once at the gate, you may have time for restrooms and food.

**8:20am Flight B Depart Louisville**

Continental Airlines/Chautauqua Airlines Flt. 3259, non-stop Canadair Regional jet service, departs for Houston. Flight time is 2 hours, 27 minutes. Complimentary beverages and a light snack will be served. Set your watch back one hour to 7:20am, Houston time.

**9:47am Flight B Arrive Houston**

Arrive Houston Intercontinental Airport, Terminal B. Don't leave any of your possessions on the aircraft. Wait at the Arrival Gate until all have deplaned. Then, walk as a group to the departure gate for your next flight, which is located in Terminal C. Once at the new departure gate, you may have time for restrooms and food.

**12:20pm Flight B Depart Houston**

Continental Airlines Flt. 073, non-stop Boeing 767 jet service, departs for Honolulu. Flight time is 8 hours, 10 minutes. Complimentary beverages and lunch will be served. Set your watch back 5 hours to 7:20am, Hawaii time.

**3:30pm Flight B Arrive Honolulu**

Wait at the Arrival Gate until all have deplaned. Don't leave any of your things on the aircraft. Walk as a group to exit the secured area. You'll be met and welcomed to the islands once you leave the secured area.

**10:25am Flight B Depart Houston**

Continental Airlines Flt. 2746, non-stop Embraer 145 jet service, departs for Louisville. Flight time is 2 hours, 18 minutes. Complimentary beverages will be served (no food service). Set your watch ahead 1 hour to 11:25am, Louisville time. This flight is operated by Expressjet Airlines, DBA Continental Express.

**1:43pm Flight B Arrive Louisville**

Wait at the arrival gate until all have deplaned. Don't leave any of your possessions on board. Then, walk as a group to Continental / Expressjet Baggage Claim. Retrieve yhour bag, and notify the airline if there is damage to it. IMPORTANT: Before departing the airport, you and the person taking you home must check-out with your group leader.

# General Information

---

As an approved school trip, all school and organization rules and policies set forth in the student handbook are in effect for the duration of this trip.

## GROUP TRAVEL HINTS

1. You are representing your school & community. Dress appropriately.
2. Good manners are always a plus wherever you are!
3. Communicate with your chaperones; let them know where you are.
4. If you feel ill, tell your chaperone immediately.
5. Review your itinerary and be aware of your responsibilities.
6. It takes time to move a large group. Be patient. Arrive on time.
7. Eat properly & sleep at night.

## MOTOR COACH INSTRUCTIONS

1. Do not leave personal items on the coach overnight.
2. Food may be taken on board as long as the coach is kept clean. Drinks should be in plastic screw-top bottles.
3. Please treat your driver with respect.
4. Never flush foreign objects in the toilet! Once the chemical flush is full, it is unusable; use rest stops when possible.
5. Do not disembark until your escort or director releases you.
6. Please, NO Flash Photography while on board the motor coach!
7. Please remain seated while vehicle is in motion.

## HOTEL INSTRUCTIONS

1. Read the instructions in your room concerning an emergency escape.
2. At curfew, you must be in your room. No one is to enter your room after curfew except chaperones or staff. Keep the noise level down.
3. Elevators are for *all* hotel guests; respect the other guests.
4. Telephones must not be used after curfew except in an emergency. You are responsible for outside phone charges to your room.
5. Keep your room locked! Keep track of the key.
6. No student is allowed in the room of a person of the opposite sex.

## RESPONSIBILITIES OF CHAPERONES

1. This tour is designed for students. Be patient, flexible, and helpful.
2. Make sure everyone understands all instructions.
3. Communicate-get to know the students by name.
4. Make sure hotel rooms are in order upon arrival and departure.
5. Monitor rooms at curfew. The after-hour rule must be enforced.
6. Make sure your students are up each morning on time.
7. Report any rule violations to the director; but don't create problems.
8. Be courteous and helpful; correct if necessary, but don't antagonize.
9. You cannot grant a favor for one unless you can do it for everyone!

## WHAT TO PACK

1. Toiletries and medications. Do not pack medication-keep it on your person. Take a written prescription in case you lose your medication.
2. Camera and plenty of film. Film is expensive in tourist spots.
3. Hairdryer, alarm clock. Use the buddy system. Only one is needed.
4. Swimsuit, cover-up and beach towel (if applicable).
5. Instrument, performance attire, uniform, & accessories (if applicable).

## WHAT TO WEAR

Casual wear is appropriate. Wear comfortable shoes!

## > ALOHA!

Mention the word and a thousand dreamy images spring to mind. But it is more than a word. It is a bridge to Hawaii's past. Aloha. Literally, the breath of life. It is woven into our community fabric and is a daily reminder that we don't just breathe the same air. We breathe the same breath. It is the basis of a genuine welcoming spirit shared with our families, friends, and guests... our visitors. The people of Hawaii would like to share their islands with you. E komo mai. Come, be welcomed and experience the essence of beauty and harmony, our Islands of Aloha.

## > OAHU

More than you imagined, Oahu is a rich and rewarding destination. Beyond the turquoise waters, the pristine beaches, and the razor-edged mountains, there's a legacy of royalty, a delicious blend of Pacific influences and the luxurious pace of island relaxation. Oahu is the sun and fun capital of the Hawaiian islands with an array of sea, land and sporting activities from which to choose. Visitors will enjoy hiking through rainforests, biking along mountain ranges and swimming in the azure blue waters of the Pacific. These activities are excellent ways to explore the environment, history culture of the island.

## > ABOUT THE HAWAIIAN SUN

Hawaii is twice as close to the equator as is most of the mainland USA, and the Hawaiian skies are usually clear and pollution-free. So, the sun shines brighter, is hotter, and burns MUCH more severely than it does in the midwest. Even if you've been going to a tanning bed daily since you learned of this trip, you must apply a sunblock (SPF 15 or stronger, and stronger is better) every few hours when you are out in the sun. Be sure to wear sunglasses, too. You will hear these warnings frequently – please heed them.

## > ABOUT SWIMMING IN THE OCEAN

If you swim in the ocean, you must use the Buddy System and be a strong swimmer. Never swim alone, pay close attention to currents and the terrain under the water in the swimming area, do not stray far from the shore (not more than 50 feet) and be careful of undertow. (Ask your Escort if you don't know what undertow is or can do. If caught in it, let it take you offshore until it dissipates and you can safely swim back without being caught again.) Watch for rocks and lava formations lurking just under the waves on an other-wise pristine sand beach. In the battle between rocks/lava and skin, the rocks and lava win every shot (the Mazucca Law of Physics).

## > HAWAII PACKING NOTE

Bring tennis shoes and/or water shoes.

You'll need some good walking shoes for the hike to Diamond Head, the self-guiding tour of the USS Missouri, and for the visit to the Polynesian Cultural Center. If swimming in the ocean off of Waikiki Beach, and at Hanauma Bay, water shoes will come in handy to protect your feet from sharp lava rock on the ocean floor. Tennis shoes can serve this function, too.

## > HAWAII PERSONAL SECURITY

On the surface, Honolulu and Waikiki are laid back, with a lazy pace. Both are crowded, and traffic passes quickly and close to the curb. Please be alert, and pay attention to what's going on around you. Here's some more tips:

1. Make sure you are always with at least two persons from our group. You are never to be alone.
2. Keep a firm grip on all belongings; keep wallets in front pockets.
3. Be very cautious with strangers. If someone repeatedly annoys you, tell your chaperone.

4. Don't flaunt wealth. Leave expensive jewelry & watches home.
5. Exercise some "Street Sense." Think for yourself. Use good judgment. Be aware of unusual or suspicious behavior. If it doesn't feel right, it probably isn't right.

# Air Travel Information

---

## **ID REQUIREMENTS**

### *Travel Within the USA*

- Persons 18 years & older must carry a valid government-issued photo-ID, like drivers license or passport.
- Persons 17 years or younger are urged to carry a school or organization photo-ID or drivers license.

### *International Travel*

- U.S. Citizens: Carry a U.S. Passport, valid 6 months after trip's end.
- Non-U.S. Citizens: Carry a valid foreign passport with re-entry permit and/or visa to USA; May have to obtain destination countries' visas.

## **LUGGAGE TAGS**

Write your name & address on tags provided and attach them to your checked and carry-on luggage. Also, name & address should be taped inside all bags.

## **CARRY-ON BAGGAGE**

Limit is one carry-on bag, plus a briefcase or purse. The sum of both pieces may not exceed the size and weight listed in the tour itinerary. Bags may be searched several times. Refer to your airline's web site for its specific policies.

## **CHECKED BAGGAGE**

Tour limit is one checked bag each, not larger or heavier than listed in the tour itinerary. Bags must be unlocked - the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) will break your "locked" lock unless it is a TSA "Accepted & Recognized Lock." Don't pack travel documents, keys, currency, jewelry, medications or irreplaceable articles in checked baggage. Refer to airline's web site for its specific policies.

## **CHECK-IN AT THE AIRPORT**

**The following are NOT PERMITTED on you or in your carry-on:**

- Any sharp, pointed or cutting instrument (knives, pointed scissors, etc.)
- Anything that can be a weapon (bat, golf club, tools, toy/real gun, etc.)
- Ammunition, chemicals or explosives (aerosol toiletry items are "okay")
- Lighters, fuel & strike-anywhere matches (also banned in checked bags)

## **PLANNING AHEAD**

- Give medical and emergency contact information to your Group Leader.
- Bring the Tour Booklet. Leave a copy of the Tour Itinerary at home.
- Don't pack film in your suitcase. New luggage scanners ruin film. Hand-carry your film. You may ask Security to hand-inspect it.
- Have NONE of the "Not Permitted" items with you. Remove metal objects and shoes with metal shanks, before entering metal detectors.
- **Wear ID Pouch on Travel Days, and have your photo-ID in it.**
- Be patient: security lines and security checks may be long.
- Persons without boarding passes aren't admitted to aircraft gate areas.
- Don't joke about security procedures or try to fool security personnel. Security's job is to treat all suspicious persons and behaviors as real threats. If Security takes you into custody, you forfeit your legal rights, you become liable for stiff fines, and you will miss the rest of your group's trip.

## **ABOARD THE AIRCRAFT**

- Pay attention to aircraft safety features, explained by the flight attendant.
- Radios & cell phones may not be operated during flight.
- Food and beverages must be consumed at your seat.
- Cabin air pressure may cause ears to ache or pop. Swallow repeatedly or chew gum to help end discomfort.
